CALL FOR SUBMISSIONS

Proposals will be accepted from Members of the National Growth Areas Alliance only (in conjunction with research partners where applicable). A written abstract will form the basis of your submission and an online form will collect information on the presenter and topic. The proposals that are chosen to be presented at the Symposium will have their written abstract published on the NGAA website (with permission).

The deadline to submit proposals is Monday 29 April, 2019 @ 5:00pm AEST.

ONLINE APPLICATION

To submit a proposal for the Inaugural Symposium please fill out the form available online [here](#). The following information will be required:

1. Presentation Title and Presenter Details
2. Reference to NGAA policy Themes - Liveability, Productivity, and Resilience
3. Permission for re-production on NGAA website and symposium publication (if required)
4. Consent for audio–visual imagery to be re-produced on NGAA website and other collateral
5. Select a preferred session format:
 - Keynote Panel: A moderated format used to spark cross-disciplinary discussion, and to dig deeply into panellists' expertise. Each panellist will give a short talk (10-15 mins), followed by a moderated panel discussion. (4 panellists).
 - Research Poster: A visual display (A1 poster or electronic), which can be displayed during the Symposium. Selected poster presenters will be asked to join a StandUp session during the symposium.
 - Focus 5: Focus5 is where presenters will be asked to speak for 5 mins, alongside other presenters addressing a similar topic. (5 min, 1 presenter)
 - Any – please indicate any if you would like to be considered for any of the above formats
 - Paper only: Submission will only be published in the symposium booklet
6. National Policy and Practice Contribution: Please describe how your proposal advances the policy platform of the fast growing outer suburbs. (up to 200 words). Where possible, name the policy area that the research with impact or inform.

7. Innovation Contribution: Please tell us how your research or practise “breaks new ground” and is innovative in its approach to addressing the challenges and opportunities of the fast growing outer suburbs. (up to 200 words)
8. One sentence description of presentation
9. Presenter Bio (50 words)
10. Headshot Image
11. Co-Presenters: (if applicable) List of names and email addresses.
12. Project image.

WRITTEN ABSTRACT

Please submit your paper using the following headings:

1. Title
2. What Problem are you solving? (up to 100 words)
3. Why is this important? (up to 200 words)
4. Describe the research or practice method and outcomes (up to 500)
5. What are the opportunities for extension to other states or NGAA members? (up to 200 words)

Abstracts are required to be in the following format:

- Heading - Arial 16 bold, sub headings Arial 12 bold and main body in Arial 11, single spacing.
- No indentation for paragraphs.
- Figures numbered, with the figure name in *italics*
- Tables numbered, with the table name in *italics*.
- References are to use, author (date), format.
- References are to be included as endnotes in Arial 9.
- Language is English/ Australian grammar, not American.
