Australia's sustained population growth will shape our society for generations. Push for free public transport as petrol hike hits cost of living

"It's not going to help people with a service they can't practically use."

Mr Bowen's stance was echoed by independent economist Saul Enlain, who told the Vational Growth Areas Alliance congress on Monday that people living on the fringes of cities were disproportionately squeezed by the sising cost-ofliving.

"A lack of local employment opportunities means its residents are forced to commute into the CBDs." Mr Eslake said.

In response, Mr Hibbins said: "I think in this instance, even if it can reduce someone's need to use their car, even if it doesn't eliminate it fully, that will still have benefits."
