NGAA's 2023 Symposium will be held across two sessions and is expected to once again draw substantial interest from across the Alliance's membership, non-member councils, state and federal government departments and peak bodies.

SYMPOSIUM OBJECTIVE

Our goal at Symposium is to showcase innovative research and practice being delivered in growth councils across Australia. It provides an opportunity for our members and partners to present work they are proud of, and to position growth councils at the leading edge of contemporary local government programs and practice.

Content presented at Symposium is housed on the NGAA website, and is used to inform our policy development and advocacy work, providing diverse and engaging case studies on a range of topics.

NGAA Symposium partners in the past have welcomed the chance to align themselves with Australia's leading local government practice, and to showcase their own work in a keynote session.

TARGET AUDIENCE

Symposium is geared towards officers and managers in NGAA member councils, government officials, academics and peak bodies. Sharing knowledge and expertise opens the door to collaboration and capacity building, which is a key tenet of NGAA.

In 2022, over 200 people registered to attend the two online sessions, representing 16 LGAs, three national peak bodies including ALGA, Infrastructure Australia, NBN Co, UDIA, Infrastructure Victoria, and academics from five universities.

CONTENT

All NGAA Members councils and their research partners are invited to submit a presentation for inclusion in the program. The themes for 2023 Symposium reflect current areas of interest to all levels of government, and provide the best chance to build capacity on these pressing topics across the NGAA membership:

Housing

- Supply, demand, and monitoring progress
- Diversity of housing types
- Affordable housing and key worker housing
- Vacant home and short stay accommodation
- Implementing the National Housing Accord
- Partnerships for social housing

- How planning can facilitate desired housing outcomes

Climate change and economic resilience

- Pathway to net zero emissions
- Support for biodiversity for human health
- Examples of climate-adapted housing and suburbs
